Music is powerful. The right song can cheer you up on a rainy day or calm you down when you are feeling incredibly stressed out. A skillful teacher can use a simple rhythm to quiet down a boisterous group of children in an instant or can sing a song to motivate a group of children to work together to clean a room that is in complete disarray. It is truly magical to observe the effects music can have on children and adults.

Music also encourages children to strengthen a number of pre-academic skills in a fun and engaging way. Below are just a few of the endless ways that children learn through musical exploration:

- All songs are made up of rhythmic patterns, and understanding patterns is a critical step in mathematical learning.
- Many children's songs encourage children to explore relationships, such as fast/slow, loud/soft, and high/low.
- Music encourages movement, which is a wonderful way to promote physical development, motor planning, and creativity.
- When engaged in a group sing-along, children are working on important socialemotional skills like taking turns, expressing emotions, and working with others to create something beautiful.
- Songs expose children to new vocabulary, different languages, and interesting rhymes, which all help with pre-reading and writing development.



CLASSROOM HIGHLIGHT: 4s MARDI GRAS

Throughout the month of February, the 4s class took an in-depth look at Mardi Gras, incorporating elements of science, social studies, literature, and the arts to learn about this cultural event. Mrs. McKay was inspired to do a unit on Mardi Gras after visiting her daughter who lives in New Orleans.

The class enjoyed preparing and eating a variety of foods from the Louisiana area, including beans and rice, po'boy sandwiches, and king's cake. Reading books about Mardi Gras piqued the children's interest even more, and they suggested doing a Mardi Gras parade of their own.

The unit culminated when the children paraded through the 3's class throwing beads to the cheering students. The class used materials they found in the classroom to create a float as well as masks and costumes. The children decided to call themselves the "Monkey-Alligator Krewe" after having read about the krewes that march in the parades.

This experiential unit gave the children a taste of Mardi Gras and also provided an opportunity for them to learn about respecting and celebrating traditions that are different from their own.
